The Minnesota Young American Leaders Program (MYALP) is an intensive, three-and-a-half day Program at the University of Minnesota, Twin Cities campus convening rising leaders across for-profit, government, and non-profit sectors who are committed to working across sectors to help their communities and our region prosper inclusively.

WHY TO APPLY?


In attending the Program, participants will 1) develop and enhance their ability to forge connections with other rising leaders across and within Minnesota's cities and regions, 2) deepen their knowledge and share perspectives regarding the state and the trajectory of our national and regional economic development, and 3) learn together from examples of and tools for innovative cross-sector collaborations that address key challenges, create opportunities, and bridge divides in our communities.

The Program offers a unique opportunity to solve complex issues, understanding the dynamics of cross-sector collaboration, and collectively discuss what needs to be invested in for the future of our state and region. Participants also have the opportunity collaborate after the Program to develop and potentially launch an initiative for public good and to build a broader capacity in our region by deepening their practical knowledge of what it takes to make shared leadership initiatives happen.
